- - Metaphor: a comparison that does not use like or as. Something that is not real.
- It's raining cats and dogs-

- Personification: giving a non-human thing human traits or actions.
- My money is running away. The cold hands of pneumonia touched Joan.
- My toys grew legs and ran away.

- My door is yelling/screeching/screaming. • Alliteration: the repetition of a specific sound or letter in a sentence Busy as bees. - Loki lounged luxuriously on the lavish log.
- The tortoise tattled to the teacher to tell them what they did. Onomatopoeia: Sounds that get turned into words. Words that represent sounds. -clap.clap -splish -splash.splash - Creeeek - Pop - Tick, tock, tick... - Boom! - Kaboomers - Sizzle - Bam -crack! -Kaboom! -POW --Ring. ving - tsss Bleh!
